PROCLAMATION NO. 59

DECLARING SATURDAY, MARCH 27, 1948, A SPECIAL BANK HOLIDAY

WHEREAS, a petition has been received from the Manila Clearing House Association requesting that the twenty-seventh day of March, nineteen hundred and forty-eight, be declared a special bank holiday;

WHEREAS, the twenty-fifth day (Holy Thursday) and the twenty-sixth day (Good Friday) of March, nineteen hundred and forty-eight, being public holidays, the twenty-seventh day (Saturday) of March, nineteen hundred and forty-eight, may be declared a special bank holiday to the great advantage of the banks and without any disadvantage to the public in general;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MANUEL ROXAS, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 30 of the Revised Administrative Code, do hereby proclaim Saturday, March twenty-seventh, nineteen hundred and forty-eight, as a special bank holiday.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the Republic of the Philippines to be affixed.

Done in the City of Manila, this ^{19th} day of March, in the year of Our Lord, nineteen hundred and forty-eight, and of the Independence of the Philippines, the second.
